### Definitions

**"Exposure Incident"** means a specific eye, mouth other mucous membrane, non-intact skin (i.e. broken skin), or other parenteral (i.e. needle, lance or other piercing or cutting tool) contact with blood or other potentially infectious materials that results from the provision of first aid pursuant to this procedure.

### **"Other Potentially Infectious Material" means:**

- (1) The following human body fluids: semen, vaginal secretions, cerebrospinal fluid, synovial fluid, plural fluid, pericardial fluid, peritoneal fluid, amniotic fluid, saliva in dental procedures, any body fluid that is visibly contaminated with blood, and all body fluids in situations where it is difficult or impossible to differentiate between bodily fluids;
- (2) Any unfixed tissue or organ (other than intact skin) from a human (living or dead); and
- (3) HIV-containing cell or tissue cultures, organ cultures, and HIV - or HBV containing culture medium or other solutions; and blood, organs, or other tissues from experimental animals infected with HIV or HBV.

1 HIV means human immunodeficiency virus

2 HBV means hepatitis B virus
